From the Desk of Fr. Hamness

What is a Chaplet?

A chaplet is a form of Christian prayer which uses a predetermined sequence of standard prayers to help a someone enter into a deeper kind of prayer to the Lord, his Blessed Mother, or to one of the other saints. Strings of beads are used to

help one remember and count this sequence of prayers.

The Rosary is one kind of chaplet, but there are others as well, such as the chaplet of Divine Mercy.

The chaplet of Divine Mercy utilizes the standard rosary, but there are other chaplets which utilize a string of beads in different configurations. The chaplet pictured above is called the chaplet of Saint Michael. It consists of nine groups of four beads to aid you in praying to St. Michael and the nine choirs of Angels. There are many more chaplets: The Sacred Heart Chaplet, the St. Joseph Chaplet, The Chaplet of the Holy Wounds of Jesus, and so on. Chrism Mass

The Chrism Mass will be held at Cathedral of the Immaculate Conception on April 14 at 6:30 p.m. Each year, the oils for sacramental anointing used in the diocese are blessed at the Chrism Mass. These oils include: the oil of the infirm, used for the sick and dying to give them strength to bear their suffering, resist evil and obtain forgiveness for sin; the oil of the catechumens, used to give strength to renounce sin and the devil; and the Sacred Chrism, the chief anointing oil used at Baptism, Confirmation and Ordination as well as the anointing of altars and walls of churches being dedicated for Christian worship. Representatives of each parish receive the blessed oils and then take them to their parishes throughout the diocese. We hope that this Lent will be a Lent that changes you and pushes you to grow deeper in your faith and that Easter is a bursting of New Life brought forth!
