As Holy Week approaches, we reflect on the Chrism Mass, a powerful expression of the unity of our diocese and the sacred nature of our faith. Celebrated by the bishop, this special Mass brings together priests from across the diocese to renew their priestly vows. At the heart of the Chrism Mass is the blessing of the holy oils: the Oil of the Sick, used for healing and strength; the Oil of Catechumens, used in preparation for baptism; and the Sacred Chrism, a fragrant oil used in baptism, confirmation, and the ordination of priests and bishops. These oils symbolize the outpouring of the Holy Spirit and our call to be Christ-like in our lives. The Chrism Mass reminds us of the gifts we receive through the sacraments and the unifying role of our bishop as shepherd of the diocese. Let us pray for our priests and bishop as they continue to serve our community with grace and dedication.

Everyone in the Diocese is welcome to the Cathedral in Crookston to attend. The Mass will begin at 6:30 p.m. on Monday, April 14th.

I am told the music is going to be especially wonderful this year, and some children and teens from Sacred Heart Parish in Frazee have been invited to sing a special piece of music.
