Entering Passiontide: The Deepening Shadow of the Cross

The final two weeks of Lent were once more commonly known as Passiontide, a period marked by a heightened focus on Christ's suffering. While the modern Roman Rite integrates these weeks into the broader Lenten journey, the spirit of Passiontide remains— a deepening contemplation of the Lord's Passion.

During this time, the Church traditionally veils crosses and images, symbolizing the obscuring of Christ's glory as he enters his final agony. The reading and prayers of the Mass emphasize the pain and sacrifice of Jesus, drawing us into a more profound understanding of his love for us.

This period invites us to move beyond mere intellectual reflection and to enter into a heartfelt communion with Christ's suffering. It is a time for increased prayer, penance, and acts of charity, preparing our hearts to more fully embrace the solemnity of Holy Week. We are called to walk with Christ, not just as observers, but as participants in his journey to the cross, understanding that through his sacrifice, we find redemption. Let us use this time to reflect on our own sins and the immense cost of salvation.

The Most Reverend Andrew H. Cozzens invites all the faithful of the Diocese of Crookston to the 2025 Chrism Mass on April 14th, at 6:30 P.M. at the Cathedral of the Immaculate Conception!

Each year, the oils for sacramental anointing used in the diocese are blessed at the Chrism Mass. These oils include: the oil of the infirm, used for the sick and dying to give them strength to bear their suffering, resist evil and obtain forgiveness for sin; the oil of the catechumens, used to give strength to renounce sin and the devil; and the Sacred Chrism, the chief anointing oil, used at Baptism, Confirmation and Ordination as well as the anointing of altars and walls of churches being dedicated for Christian worship.

Pastors or other parish representatives will receive the blessed oils and take them to their parishes throughout the diocese.
