Fanning into Flame Our Eucharistic Faith, Becoming a Missionary Parish

In the sanctuaries of our churches and chapels, a lamp perpetually burns-a flickering flame that signals the reserved presence of Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament. Each of us, too, is called to be a light that burns brightly and at all times. We are called to share our faith by reflecting the love of Christ to those we encounter each day.

However, as missionary disciple, we can't always do this on our own. We need to band together with other members of the body of Christ so that together we shine even more brightly in the world. In this article, I want to outline the kind of priorities we need in our parishes so that we can more effectively "fan into flame" our Eucharistic faith(see 2 Timothy 1:6)!

One of the keys to parishes shining brightly is to be "outward bound"- that is, geared not just to offer good things and then hope that people show up, but to actively search for those who need to hear the gospel.

As Pope Francis has exhorted us, a parish needs to be "in contact with the homes and the lives of its people." Otherwise, it risks becoming "a useless structure out of touch with people or a self-absorbed group made up of a chosen few". (Evangelii Gaudium, 28)

The Mission of a Parish.

*First is the celebration of the liturgy, especially the Eucharistic Liturgy. The Eucharist is the heart of every parish, and for most Catholics, Sunday Mass is their point of contact with the Church. How the liturgy is celebrated in our parishes matters a great deal. God's people are impacted and attracted by thoughtful preaching, beautiful liturgical music, reverence for the Body and Blood of the Lord, respect for one another. We should ask ourselves: Does our celebration of the liturgy help to form, make and send fourth missionary disciples? Does it make people want to return week after week?


