Fanning into Flame Our Eucharistic Faith, Becoming a Missionary Parish

A Changed Life. In my own diocese of Baltimore, many parishes have begun to transform into missionary parishes, actively seeking to reach those who are far from the Church. One young man whose life was changed through the outreach of a parish is Matthew Hassaine. Matthew is now a second –year seminarian, but when he was curious about the Catholic faith, it was the warm and welcoming outreach of parishioners that led him to embrace the faith.

Matthew was raised in a Christian home and regularly attended Christian services. But a visit to France during his college studies sparked a flame in his heart that has since then burned more brightly. While in France, he learned of his grandmother's passing. Grief –Stricken, he stepped inside Notre Dame Cathedral to light a candle. Not knowing ehat to say to God, he just waited. Then, as the sounds of the organ filled the place, he sensed God's presence. He realized in that moment that he didn't know how to pray, but *the Church* did, and it stepped in to pray for him when he needed it most.

Back in the US, Matthew felt a persistent call to join the Catholic Church. As he was wrestling with this decision, he learned about a group of Catholics who were hosting Alpha, an evangelistic outreach program, in the restaurant where he worked. Night after night, he noticed how welcoming and kind they were.

One night, after a few of the leaders were getting ready to leave, Matthew opened up to them about his desire to jin the order of Christian Initiation for Adults (then called RCIA). He also shared how it was probably too late for him to join for this year. Their response surprised him: "Let that be a problem for us, not for you! Here is the contact information for Karen, the director of faith formation at our parish." That same night, Matthew sent Karen an email, and when he woke up the next morning, he discovered that she had already answered. She invited him to meet her at the church that Sunday before Mass, and he ended up joining OCIA right then and there. Matthew shares, "I am so grateful that the Alpha leaders at the restaurant didn't see me a just someone who needed to go through the process. They saw me as a person being called by God. And it's thanks to them that I'm where I am today.




