From the Desk of Fr. Hamness:

In my side-job up in the Archives up in Crookston I come across many interesting things. This past Tuesday I was corresponding with a man looking for his great, great grandparents’ wedding records from 1897. He had a newspaper clipping that mentioned their wedding reception, but he wanted to see the Sacramental record of the marriage from the church’s record books. I managed to find the record of the wedding, plus the Baptism records of his great grand father and his siblings. Once I had locat-
ed them, I finally got around to reading the newspaper clipping that my interlocutor had sent to me. It is from the Crookston Tribune, dated Jan-
uary 21, 1897. It seems like the wedding reception was quite a party! It was on a Wednesday evening, began at 9:00 p.m. and ended at 5:00 in the morning! I wonder if the guests made it to work the next day.

Farley-Menard Wedding.

One of the pleasantest social events of the season was the occa-
sion of the wedding last evening of Joseph Farley and Miss Clara Men-
ard. Father Fournier performed the ceremony at 8:30 o'clock at St. Ann's church and at nine o'clock the reception was opened at the G. A. R. hall. Over one hundred and fifty invited guests took part in the fes-
tivities and a royal good time was indulged in until five o'clock this morning. At about one o'clock a sumptuous lunch was served.

After the assembly had broken up the happy couple left for the home of the bride's parents in Lowell.
