

From the Desk of Fr. Hamness:

I think we were all brokenhearted to hear about the tragedy at Annunciation Catholic Church in Minneapolis this past Wednesday. A man who works for the Diocese of Crookston is the father of one of the teachers at Annunciation School who was present at the Mass when the tragedy took place. One of our own parishioners is a cousin of this same, brave teacher, who was actually the lector for the Mass and was standing at the ambo proclaiming the Psalm when the shooting began.

I am sure we have many other connections amongst us to people who were close to this tragedy.

Many people are stunned right now. That is what evil does to us. It knocks the wind out of our sails. It deflates us. Our comfort is only in the Lord. "The LORD is close to the brokenhearted, [He] saves those whose spirit is crushed." — *Psalm 34:19*

Let's remember those who have died in our prayers, and let's not forget about the wounded either. We also have to pray for those who were not physically harmed but were still terrified. The emotional and spiritual damage may be the hardest wounds to heal. Let's entrust them to our Merciful God.
