From the Desk of Fr. Hamness:



Sister Annella Zervas, O.S.B. (1900–1926), was a Benedictine nun from Moorhead, Minnesota, remembered for her holiness, humility, and serene suffering. At age 16, she entered St. Benedict's Convent in St. Joseph, Minnesota, where she became a postulant and later a novice. Taking the name Sister Annella, she dedicated herself to the Benedictine ideals of prayer, work, and obedience. Her life was marked by quiet devotion, charity toward others, and a deep interior life centered on the Eucharist.

In her early twenties, Sister Annella developed a severe and disfiguring skin disease, believed to be lupus vulgaris or another chronic infection. The illness caused intense pain and isolation, yet she bore her suffering

with extraordinary patience and cheerfulness, uniting it to Christ's Passion. Her fellow sisters and visitors were deeply moved by her serenity and holiness amid agony. She died at only 26 years old on August 14, 1926, the eve of the Assumption, peacefully accepting death as "God's holy will."

After her death, reports of favors and healings through her intercession spread, and devotion to her memory grew in Minnesota and beyond. Though not officially canonized, many continue to regard Sister Annella Zervas as a model of hidden sanctity and redemptive suffering.
