It is about that time of year when I begin to wonder if there is anyone who would like to become a Catholic and enter the Church at Easter. Maybe you know of someone. The step-by-step process of entering the Church is called the Order of Christian Initiation of Adults (O.C.I.A.) but it used to be called the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (R.C.I.A.) until last year. This Fall we could have an "Inquiry Class" for those deciding if they want to enter the Church, and after the New Year we could begin O.C.I.A.
