A Word about the Antiphons

Perhaps you may wonder, "What is an antiphon?" An antiphon is a short phrase or sentence that highlights certain themes present in the Sacred Liturgy. Each Mass has three antiphons assigned to it: 1) the Entrance Antiphon, also known as the Introit, 2) the Offertory Antiphon, and 3) the Communion Antiphon. When musicians wish to extend the length of these antiphons, verses of certain psalms which have a similar theme are sung, with the antiphon interspersed between the psalm verses. We already do this during Holy

Communion.

To help you see how these antiphons highlight the themes of each week's Mass, have a look at the three antiphons for Christmas Morning Mass, for example.

Entrance: Today a light will shine upon us, for the Lord is born for us; and he will be called Wondrous God, Prince of peace, Father of future ages: and his reign will be without end.

Offertory: For it is God who has established the world, it shall never be moved; your throne is established from of old; you are from all eternity.

Communion: Rejoice, O Daughter Sion; lift up praise, daughter Jerusalem: Behold, your King will come, the Holy One and Savior of the world.

You can easily see how rich these texts are as they comment on the liturgy of the day and help us meditate on these mysteries of our Faith. All antiphons had specific melodies and music to accompany them when they were written in Latin. Directly after the Second Vatican Council, once the liturgy was permitted to take place in English, we did not immediately have music to accompany these texts, so we got into the habit of singing other things in their place, because we didn't want to have Sunday Mass without music. What we had to fill the gap were various hymns and religious songs that were sung in other contexts. Now, 60 years later, we are starting to have music composed for these texts when they are in English. Currently, you are hearing an example of this during Holy Communion. You are hearing the text of the proper Communion Antiphon with verses of psalms interspersed. These antiphons are treasures of the Church's sacred liturgy, and the bishops of the Church have been pushing us to reintegrate them into the life of every parish.

Yes, it would be easier to just stick with the songs and hymns we've become accustomed to over the past 60 years, but we would be losing a great deal. These antiphons have accompanied the church's liturgy for nearly 2000 years, and I certainly don't want to be the generation that gave up on them. In a nutshell, that's why you've started hearing them at Mass again these past few years. We are not getting rid of all the songs and hymns you've been used to. They will still be heard, but there is room to do the antiphons too.




