Custodian & Groundskeeper Norman Adams—-Monday and Friday Today in the Gospel reading we spend a little time with St. Joseph, who was a good, decent man caught off guard by events he never expected. Joseph had plans for a simple life with Mary, and suddenly everything seemed to fall apart. When he learned Mary was with child, his heart must have been heavy with fear and confusion. He didn't know what to think, but he knew he didn't want to hurt her. Sometimes fear shows up quietly, in sleepless nights and worried thoughts.

That's when God met Joseph right where he was...in a dream. The angel's message was plain and comforting: "Do not be afraid." Those words changed everything. Joseph learned that God was at work in ways far bigger than he could see, and that he had an important role to play. The fear didn't vanish magically, but it no longer had the final say.

When Joseph woke up, he didn't make a speech or ask for proof. He simply got up and did what God asked; he took Mary into his home and trusted the road ahead. Joseph shows us that faith doesn't always look bold or dramatic. Sometimes it looks like getting up the next morning and doing the right thing.

As Christmas draws near, may Joseph remind us that God often speaks softly, and that trust, one step at a time, can carry us through our fears.


