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Advent is a time to “make straight the way of the Lord.” That means it is a time to prepare to welcome Lord at his birth. We prepare to greet him when we put up festive decorations and Christmas lights, along with wreaths and mistletoe, but the most important preparations are from within. We need to make our hearts into hospitable homes to receive Jesus. There are many ways to do this by prayer, fasting, and almsgiving, but there is still one essential component: reconciliation. Make a good confession before Christmas! Clean out the cobwebs and dust of sin and make your soul sparkling and fresh.

Remember, there is confession before most every Mass, and there is an extended period on Saturday afternoons from 3:00-4:00 in Frazee, but there are other opportunities as well at neighboring parishes, so check their websites and bulletins. Moreover, the priests of our region have committed helping with to a “Day of Grace” at Holy Rosary in Detroit Lakes on Thursday, December 18. This is a day when a priest will be available to hear your confession from 11:00 a.m. until 6:00 p.m. I have signed up to take a couple of hours and the other hours will be filled by other priests from the surrounding towns. This is for anyone from any parish, not just Holy Rosary parishioners.

To help you prepare, I am including an Examination of Conscience as an insert in this bulletin. If you have forgotten how to go to confession, the “procedure” along with an Act of Contrition is on the back side of the insert.

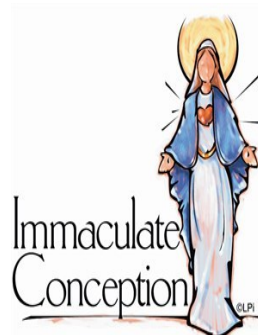



This January more than 10 priests and deacons and several individuals trained in the healing ministry will gather at the Pastoral Center in Crookston to share the mighty works of Jesus Christ and His Healing power in talks and individual sessions.

Topics such as the healing power of the Eucharist and Reconciliation. Time for private prayer in adoration throughout the retreat weekend. You will be able to take advantage of confession during the weekend as well as sign up for a private spiritual direction session with a priest or deacon. You will also have the opportunity to spend private time in a prayer session with a team made up of a priest or deacon and one or two individuals trained in the healing ministry.

On Sunday the 25th the retreat will close with a Healing Service at the Cathedral (Across the parking lot) open to the public from 1 to 3 p.m.
